Granderson Road cannot physically support the number of new residents that will move into to the area.

Granderson Road is a two way street as indicated by the stop sign on the corner of Granderson and McMurdo. McMurdo is the only exit off Granderson that enables residents to head towards Wale Rd.

I have asked to see a copy of the Traffic Assessment and was told it is protected under the Privacy Act. I believe that this is yet another "roadblock" that shows a lack of transparency on the part of the City and the developers. It is a lack of respect for the residents of Langford.

There are two oak trees on 636 Granderson Road. These majestic old trees are on the edge of the 636 property and I would like confirmation from the City and Developer that they will not be taken down.
